Referring to the successful second AAA Conference held at the Saint George Hotel, Pretoria in May 2019, attended by just under 300 delegates, you are herewith invited **to the third AAA Conference and AGM** that will, after a third postponement in 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic, now be held on **24-25 March 2022** at the **East London International Convention Centre**, in East London, Eastern Cape.

As AAA members should know by now, due to the Covid-19 pandemic that struck the world and South Africa in March 2020 and subsequent lockdown measures taken by the SA Government throughout 2020 and into 2021, the AAA Board had to cancel the 2020 conference altogether, and then had to postpone the 2021 conference three times. However, in terms of the current level 1 limitations in January 2022, the Board is quite positive that by the end of March 2022, the chances are fairly certain that the conference will go ahead.

The East London ICC has all the necessary protocols in place to ensure your safety and protection. The Board would also like to encourage all delegates who plan to attend who has not yet vaccinated, to get the vaccine against the virus before the conference. It is really the only tool available to eliminate the risk of getting seriously ill should you contract the virus.

Conference theme: The Board of Directors of the AAA decided that the theme for the 2020/21 conference that was going to address the continuous challenges that academic administrators are dealing with, referring to violent student protests on campuses, striking staff, institutions that are becoming a stage for opportunistic politicking, financial uncertainties relating to government funding and study fees, NSFAS under administration, increasing corruption in HEI's, the pandemic and its impact on higher education administration work, to name a few "VUCA" factors, is still very relevant, and therefore retained this theme.

A bleak picture indeed, but it is the work environment of many of the AAA members, putting in so much effort to perform their duties professionally under very trying circumstances. This conference should create an opportunity for members to share their experiences and how to find coping mechanisms to deal with the VUCA factors. And of course, to share best practices that will make our work more efficient and effective by learning from each other.
