This explores the evolving role of academic administrators in promoting sustainable good governance, drawing on insights from the *past, present* and the *future* of academic administration in higher and further education.








The past

In the present context, academic administrators are increasingly recognized as key enablers for integrating sustainable good governance practices within their institutions.
















